Communication for health, equity, and social justice

Strategic Plan Summary

The CSCD program at Temple University advocates for communication as fundamental human right that is central to health, equity, and social justice and to provides cutting edge clinical and academic education and research training. We focus on five key areas: increasing educational access for students, increasing diversity in the profession and in our workplace, conducting research with our students, increasing awareness of communication, d/Deafness, and communication disorders, and supporting the success and well-being of our students. To support educational access, we work to increase financial supports for students and to foster work life balance for our students. To support diversity, we are working on recruitment efforts for students and faculty and provide educational opportunities to increase cultural humility. A research focus is educating students around research opportunities and involving students directly in research activities. Awareness of the field and professions is key to our success – we will host events and create social media and newsletters to share information about the field and our programs. To provide our students with a positive educational environment we are increase access to needed education materials, learning supports, hands on clinical experiences, and supports for students' academic needs at the graduate and undergraduate levels. To achieve these goals, we partner with our community both in providing services and assessing the needs our clients and families as well as our students.

Progress towards these goals is monitored on an ongoing basis. Annual department meetings at the end of the academic year are used to summarize progress and evaluate the need for change in goals or strategies. Student input is collected through a student faculty committee that meets twice each semester. Students are also encouraged to contact faculty, program directors and the department chair as needed. Faculty provide input in both program specific meetings as well as the department faculty meetings. Community input is collected through our advisory board meetings. All of the sources of information inform our plans.
