A stipend of \$5000 awarded to interdisciplinary teams to be shared among team members to compensate for the time spent conceptualizing and developing a team-taught GenEd course.

Used to conceptualize and develop Human Behavior & The Photographic Image in collaboration with a colleague from Tyler School of Art.

In this class, students use their digital cameras to investigate the photographic series. We look at photography in both its historical context with the advent of documentary photography and photojournalism, and narrative photography in its more contemporary use - when photographers use it to chronicle their own lives and to tell a story. Through these exercises of looking at and making photographic images several core concepts of social work, along with theories of human behavior in the social environment are introduced. Students learn not only about the place photography holds in our culture, but our culture itself, and more about their place in that culture. Students critically analyze published photographs, as well as photographs made during the class. The semester culminates with a class exhibition where students present their photographs to the public, demonstrating their understanding of human behavior in the social environment.
